The applicant has filed M.A. No. 3449 of 2022 seeking leave to appeal against the order dated 13.07.2022passed in OA 2053 of 2021 in the Hon'ble Supreme Court in terms of Section 31 of the Armed Forces Tribunal Act, 2007. There being delay in filing the same, M.A. no. 3450 of 2022 has also been filed seeking condonation.

2. After hearing learned counsel for the parties and after going through the order, in our considered view, there appears to be no point of law much less any point of law of general public importance involved in the order, therefore, prayer for grant of leave to appeal is rejected. Accordingly, both the MAs stand dismissed.
