<u>MA 4065/2023</u>

There being delay in filing of OA, MA 4065/2023 has been filed seeking condonation of delay. Considering the fact that grant of disability and disability pension arising thereof is a continuous right and in view of law laid in the case of <u>Union of India and others</u> v. <u>Tarsem Singh</u> (2008) 8 SCC 648, the delay in filing the application is condoned.

2. MA stands disposed of.

3. In accordance to the policy laid down after the rejection of the claim for grant of disability element the applicant has not exhausted to departmental remedy of appeal. Learned counsel for the applicant, however, invites our attention to the legal notice cum representation filed on 23rd March, 2023. In our considered view, the departmental remedy of appeal has to be availed of by the individual himself and merely because the counsel has sent a legal notice, we do not deem it appropriate to hold that the remedy of appeal has been exhausted.

4. Considering the fact, the appeal has not been filed by the applicant, we dispose of the matter with a direction to the applicant to submit an appeal within a period of one month and the respondents to decide the same by way of a speaking order within a period of six month. If still aggrived, the applicant may re-agitate the matter in accordance with law.

5. OA stands disposed of.
