ORDER
18.07.2024

Vide order dated 31.05.2024, the Hon'ble Court has directed here as under :

“In this application, the issue at hand concerns whether the amount in question, which was stayed by this Court, has been refunded by the Bank or not.

2. There are conflicting assertions from the parties involved, i.e. the applicant denies the bank's contention that the entire amount has been refunded to him and on the other side, the Bank claims that the entire amount has indeed been refunded to the applicant.

3. We direct this case is to be placed before the Principal Registrar of this Tribunal to hear both the parties and review the documents provided and the Principal Registrar is directed to adjudicate the issue after hearing all concerned parties and submit a report to this Court by 31st July, 2024 addressing the rival contentions regarding the refund amount in question.”

2. Consequently, notices were issued to both the parties. Pursuant to which, Mr. Mohan Kumar, Advocate for applicant, Mr. Arvind Kumar, Advocate for R-1 to R-3, Mr. Ashok Kumar, Advocate for R-4 & R-5 and Mr. Kambod Singh, Chief Manager, SBI CPPC, appeared before this Court.

3. The concerned Chief Manager, SBI CPPC, claims that a total sum of Rs. 15,20,754/- was required to be recovered from the applicant i.e. Smt. Anusua Roy. It is contended that a sum of Rs. 7,42,889/- was recovered and balance of Rs. 7,77,865/- was never ever recovered. He further submits that recovered sum of Rs. 7,42,889/- has already been remitted to the applicant on 10.05.2019 along with the due interest. It is also submitted that since the recovered amount has already been remitted back, therefore, there is no question of any outstanding amount to be paid to the applicant.

4. Learned counsel for the applicant vehemently resists the contention of the Chief Manager, SBI CPPC and submitted that no payment has been received till date.

5. In view of the above, respondent Nos. 4 & 5 are directed to place on record a statement of account duly supported with an affidavit with an advance copy to the applicant. Likewise, applicant is also directed to place on record a statement of account duly supported with an affidavit with an advance copy to the respondents for reconciliation of record. The affidavit shall clearly depict the following information in a tabulated manner :

6. Both the parties are directed to exchange the aforesaid statement upto 23.07.2024.
