It is stated that in pursuance to the order passed on 13.12.2024 and the applicant submitted the Income Tax Certificate, the Medical Entitlement Card has been issued to the mother of the applicant and to that effect, an order passed on 13.12.2024 by this Tribunal has been complied with. Taking note of the aforesaid and on perusal of the record we find that the prayer made by the applicant in Para 8 reads as under:

- a. To pass the directions to consider and grant Medical Entitlement Certificate (MEC) of Applicant's mother to the applicant.
- b. To grant such other relief appropriate to the facts and circumstances of the case as deemed fit and proper.

2. It is clear that the interim prayer claim for and ordered by this Tribunal by a detailed order passed on 13.12.2024 and the main relief claimed by the applicant are the same. The respondents

have already issued the Medical Entitlement Card (MEC) to the applicant's mother and taking note of the detailed order passed on 13.12.2024, we find that the relief claimed for by the applicant has been granted and now the applicant is being rendered infructuous. The respondents shall continue to grant benefit to the applicant in pursuance to the certificate issued as indicated. However, the claim shall be subject to the conditions that the mother of the applicant meets the conditions necessary for her entitlement to continue with the Medical Entitlement Card (MEC). With the aforesaid, the application stands as disposed of.
