Heard learned counsel for the petitioner.

The petitioner has been discharged under Army Rule 13(3) III (V) being an undesirable person. He said to have put in 9 years and 122 days of service. He is also suffering from HIV. So far as discharge order is concerned that had been correctly passed because he has four red ink entries in his service career. However since he is HIV and has put in 9 years and 122 days of service, he may make a proper representation to the authorities for condonation of the period so as to make it 10 years that will enable him to get some monetary benefits. Not only he but his wife is also suffering from HIV. Therefore this will be an act of mercy if respondents condone the period to make it 10 years so as to enable the petitioner for monetary benefits in accordance with law. He may make a proper

representation before the authorities and the authorities may consider the matter sympathetically.

With these observations, the petition is disposed of with no order as to costs.
